**RHB, RTRS** – The Regional table of the Southeast Europe Stability Pact is being held in Belgrade, with about 300 participants from 80 countries. The Serbian President, **Boris Tadic**, stated at the beginning of the session that a full cooperation with the ICTY had to be achieved in Serbia in order to have reconciliation in the region and that **Ratko Mladic** had to be arrested immediately. **BH Radio 1** by Slavisa Numic, Belgrade– BiH delegation at the conference is lead by the BiH Foreign Minister **Mladen Ivanic**. In addition to pointing out to the importance of the cooperation with the ICTY, Tadic also emphasized Serbia is to have good neighborly relations with Montenegro and that it is dedicated to peaceful compromise on Kosovo status. SCG Foreign Minister **Vuk Draskovic** also stressed all obstacles for full cooperation with the ICTY have to be removed, adding that Serbia will not disappoint Europe. EU Enlargement Commissioner **Olli Rehn** also address attendees emphasizing that the establishment of another small country in the Balkans is additional reason for establishment of good regional cooperation, since integrations are especially important and necessary for small countries. Special Coordinator of Stability Pact **Erhard Bussek** expressed satisfaction with the fact that Montenegrin referendum was peaceful; and added that the situation in the Balkans has improved significantly since 1999 when the Pact was established. The HR **Christian Schwarz-Schilling** would address the session.

<p>SNSD's Vasic: For SNSD, referendum story is over; Dodik only talked about theoretical situation</p>	<p><b>FENA</b> – SNSD Secretary General <b>Rajko Vasic</b> has stated in Banja Luka today that SNSD President <b>Milorad Dodik</b> has never talked about concrete plans, moves or steps with regard to alleged organizing of the referendum in the RS, and Vasic stressed entire story has got unnecessary connotations. <i>"SNSD deems the referendum story is over, regardless to what our president told about it in media,"</i> underlying Vasic adding Dodik was talking only about theoretical, democratic possibility, i.e. <i>"about modern tools to solve political problems in this part of Europe."</i> Vasic concluded SNSD would disclose "more detailed" platform on constitutional changes after the elections.</p>
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<p><b>Debate on referendum initiative</b></p>
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<p>HR Schwarz-Schilling in Belgrade : there is no connection btw statuses of Kosovo/Montenegro and RS</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b> by <u>Vesna Simic, Belgrade</u> – During his official visit to Belgrade, the High Representative <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> met the Serbian President <b>Boris Tadic</b> and Serbian Prime Minister <b>Vojislav Kostunica</b>, as well as leader of Serb Orthodox Church <b>Patriarch Pavle</b>. At these occasions, Schwarz-Schilling commented recent statements bringing into relationship the Montenegrin referendum and the status of the RS stating former should be treated entirely differently as it held a status of the republic in the former Yugoslavia, which is not the case with RS that has been established by Dayton Peace Agreement. <i>“There is no [such thing as] historical RS, it is a creation of Dayton Peace Agreement, and that is the base. And in Dayton Agreement, there is no room for separation or destruction of the state of BiH,”</i> commented Schwarz-Schilling. HR stressed the Serbian officials agreed there is no room for organizing referendum in the RS and that legalities must be respected in order to ensure peace in the region, adding that there are not many politicians in BiH advocating for the RS independence. Following the meeting with Schwarz-Schilling, Tadic’s Cabinet stated it is important to respect the consensus reached in BiH since it represents the will of three equal peoples. Kostunica’s Cabinet pointed out the importance to insist on the Dayton Agreement that is based on the Entities. <b>RTRS</b>– During his visit to Belgrade, Schwarz-Schilling stated that there is no connection between the status of Kosovo or Montenegro and status of RS. <i>“BiH is a sovereign country with determined borders recognised by the international treaties, and the RS is integral part of BiH”</i>, said Schwarz-Schilling. <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 3 ‘International Community cannot turn its head from ICTY fugitives’ by <u>L.Sinanovic</u> – In a statement to DA, Schwarz-Schilling stressed that cooperation between Serbia, Montenegro and BiH has to be stronger when it comes to arrests of the remaining ICTY fugitives. <i>“We talked also about establishment of single regional trade, something that looks like CEFTA [Central European Free Trade Area]. 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<p>Serbian PM Kostunica: DPA is a guarantee of BiH stability; HR: BiH borders are internationally recognized, no issue about that</p>	<p><b>Oslobodjenje</b> cover splash 'There will be no referendum in BiH', pg 3 'There will be no referendum' by B.Boskov – After meeting with High Representative <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b>, Serbian Prime Minister <b>Vojislav Kostunica</b> concluded that <i>"Dayton Peace Agreement is a guarantee of BiH stability"</i> and he repeated Blegrade's official stance of advocating for BiH's <i>"preservation and honouring"</i>. After meetings with Serbian President <b>Boris Tadic</b> and SCG Foreign Minister <b>Vuk Draskovic</b>, Schwarz-Schilling gave a statement to B92 in which he rejected any possibility of referendum to be used during the talks on the constitutional changes in BiH. <i>"BiH was created on grounds of the DPA and the RS as well is established on that bases and is directly connected with Federation in BH, so the issue cannot be solved without internal agreement of concerned parties and that has no relation with SCG"</i> told Schwarz-Schilling to B92. Since one of the subjects during the meeting was ICTY cooperation, HR said that few years ago it was realistic that <b>Radovan Karadzic</b> and <b>Ratko Mladic</b> were on BiH territory, but he added that there is no proof that two of them are on BiH territory today. <i>"In any case, there is no proof that they could be located in any place there"</i> said HR. <b>Vecernje Novosti</b> pg 2 'Dayton is protecting borders' by <u>Dusan Stojakovic</u> – In a half-page interview to daily, HR reiterates that there is no historical RS and that the borders are internationally recognised and there are no open issued about this.</p>
<p>SCG Foreign Minister Draskovic: Western Balkans can go either towards Europeanization or Kosovoization</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 3 'To strictly respect principle of not changing of borders', mentioned on cover by <u>Lana Sinanovic</u> – Following the meeting with the HR <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b>, SCG Foreign Minister <b>Vuk Draskovic</b> stated that the Western Balkans is in sensitive phase and move forward in either of two paths: <i>"One is Europeanization of the Balkans and the other is its Kosovoization. In order to remain in the right path, it is necessary to strictly respect principles of not changing current borders,"</i> said Draskovic. Serbian President <b>Boris Tadic</b> underlined all open issues between BiH and Serbia should be solved trough dialogue. Serbian Prim- Minister <b>Vojislav Kostunica</b> emphasized the importance of economic cooperation as well as accomplishment of the single free trade agreement.</p>

<p>OHR: RS has no jurisdiction to organize referendum</p>	<p><b>BHT1-</b> Commenting the recent statement issued by RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b> on referendum for separation in the RS, <b>OHR</b> warned that International Community would not tolerate endangering the sovereignty and integrity of BiH announcing the possible use of High Representative's Bonn powers that include removal of the politicians in that case. OHR's spokesperson <b>Ljiljana Radetic</b> stressed, <i>"it is important to avoid possible confusion that this issue might create. <p>RS PM Dodik: OHR should act in line with Dayton upon war crimes, integrations</p>	<p><b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 2 'OHR only in line with Dayton' by <u>SRNA</u>– RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b> stated in Sofia that OHR should only act upon Dayton issues, such as war crimes, integrations and similar. According to Dodik, OHR should give up its authorities, especially regarding Europe-related issues, stressing the decisions on EU road should be made by BiH people. Dodik is taking part in conference of Party of European Socialists, which started Monday in Sofia entitled "European Alliance and Balkans: to develop progressive plan for joining".</p>

<p>SPONA continues with petition for scheduling of the referendum in the RS; signatures to be submitted to the RSNA</p>	<p><b>BHT1</b> <u>By Zoran Sarenac</u> – In a number of the cities around the RS, SPONA NGO has organised the petition under motto “The Choice is Ours” calling for scheduling of referendum for RS independence. According to the NGO members, more than 50.000 votes have been collected in the RS supporting referendum for separation. SPONA President <b>Dane Cankovic</b> announced submitting signed petition to the RS National Assembly at the right moment <i>“for delegates to decide what to do with the will of people”</i>. <i>“We are not going to stop there, we will hand in the signed petition to the International Organisations and inform international politicians on the evident desire of Serbs in RS not to live in the imposed BiH,”</i> added Cankovic. Reporter noted that the recent statement issued by RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b> that RS status should be connected to Kosovo status seems to have instigated citizens. <p>President of the Serbian National Council of Kosovo Ivanovic: It cannot be demanded secession of Kosovo, leaving BiH unitary state</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2 ‘Ivanovic: It cannot be demanded secession of Kosovo, leaving BiH unitary state’ <u>by Srna</u> – Following the meeting with BiH Presidency member <b>Borislav Paravac</b>, President of the Serbian National Council [SNB] of Kosovo <b>Milan Ivanovic</b> stated in Sarajevo that he is astonished with the policy of International Community on Balkans, which is committed on one side for secession of Kosovo, and on another on unitary BiH: <i>“How could the national minority could be given a right on secession, offering at the same time to constitutional peoples something below that.”</i> Paravac and members of the delegation of Serbs from Kosovo concluded in Sarajevo that all issues in the relation with the final status of Kosovo should be resolved through the democratic dialogue between Belgrade and Pristina, in accordance with principles of international law.</p>



<p>SRS ' Mihajlica calls on PM Dodik to raise referendum issue in RSNA; HoR MP Kunic says Dodik is right</p>	<p><b>Hayat</b> – Representative in the BiH House of Representatives <b>Petar Kunic</b> said that – in case Kosovo becomes an independent state – Serbs from RS should be entitled to raise the question of their separation from BiH. <i>“Kosovo can be compared with RS,”</i> said Kunic. <i>“It is not acceptable that referendum is discussed only immediately before the elections,”</i> stated Serb Radical Party leader <b>Milanko Mihajlica</b>, adding that SRS would support any initiative in Parliament for the discussion on referendum and police reform. <b>RTRS, Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 6 ‘Referendum in Parliament’ by <u>SRNA, Glas Srpske</u> pg 5 ‘Neither sale or surrender’ by <u>D.Mo.</u> –Mihaljica called upon RS Prime Minister Dodik to raise the issue of referendum on succession of RS in RS National Assembly, in order to prove that his latest statements were not only marketing tricks and part of pre-electoral campaign. <b>Glas Srpske</b> pg 3 ‘A Serb does not have what others do’ by <u>Z. Markovic</u> – Kunic says although BiH Constitution does not contain provisions on referendum, its preamble contains provisions on the right to self-determination. Professor <b>Mile Dmicic</b> noted there is a connection, in both political and formal-legal context, between Montenegro, Kosovo and RS adding: <i>“Venice Commission had verified constitutional solutions in Srpska as in one of two state-building bodies with equal rights. <p>Bosniak intellectuals, deputies in RS: only BiH Parliament can schedule referendum for abolishment or succession of the RS</p>	<p><b>BHT1, Hayat, Oslobođenje</b> pg 2 ‘Dodik’s behaviour is danger for BiH’ <u>not signed</u>– <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2 ‘Dodik is calling up for hate and clashes’ by <u>Fena</u>– Commenting recent statements of the high ranking RS officials on referendum and connecting the RS with status of Kosovo, The Council of Bosniak Intellectuals’ Congress VKBI deems that the RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b>’s statements advocating for a secession of the RS from BiH is a ‘<i>drastic, irresponsible and worrying form of acting against peace in BiH</i>’. <b>RHB – Remzija Kadric</b>, on behalf of the RS Council of Peoples, and <b>Ramiz Salkic</b> from the Bosniak Caucus in the RS National Assembly, strongly criticised recent statements on announcing a referendum for the secession of RS. I still believe in referendum as democratic tool for decision making, but at the state and not entity level."</i>

<p>Oslobodjenje op-ed: It is a time for democratic duel of BiH and RS</p>	<p><b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 9 'Referendum is needed, indeed' op-ed by <u>Zija Dizdarevic</u> – Commenting recent statement by RS PM <b>Milorad Dodik</b> who said all peoples in BiH are entitled to decide on its destiny through referendum, editorial reads that this is a case of the <i>"political vampirism under cover of the cloak of democracy, nothing more but politics that promise new bloodshed... Dodik's demand is not only anti-constitutional act, but it also denying the Dayton Peace Agreement. It is warmongering."</i> Author notes that a desire for secession, widely present in the RS, could be politically and legally denied, but such legal action would not mean disappearance of the desire itself. Stressing that Dodik's logics invokes a contra-referendum at the state level on a question <i>"Are you for abolishment of the entities?"</i> editorial concludes: <i>"There is a need to check stance of BiH citizens towards their state. If 55% does not want it, let it not exist. BiH needs democratically based majority of citizens behind it, that would allow establishing of interior political stability and independence, in order to start organizing itself finally with those who want it. <p>DA op-ed: All RS parties gave IC examples of true anti-Dayton acts; such doing should face sanctions</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 3 'Serb unity of destruction' op-ed by <u>Husein Urahovac</u> – Commenting that by blocking work of BiH Parliament and stories on secession of RS, editorial reads that Serb politicians clearly showed they do not want state of BiH: <i>"All of parties from RS, in less than seven days, gave to BiH public a reason for major concern, and to representatives of International Community examples of true anti-Dayton acts. Such doing should face sanctions."</i></p>
<p>SD op-ed on demand for referendum in RS: BiH ahs returned from its Dayton to pre-war phase</p>	<p><b>Slobodna Dalmacija</b> cover pg splash and pgs 10 and 11 'Leaders in Banja Luka live for secession' by <u>V. Vegar</u> comments on the initiative to organize the referendum on the RS status. According to the author, High Representative <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> took this situation very seriously and therefore he went to Belgrade to explain to Serbian leaders that the referendum in Montenegro and independence of Kosovo cannot be a model for the announced referendum in the RS. The author says that <i>'this is a Sisyphean task. The coordination between Belgrade and Banja Luka exists, the goal has been set clearly and everything else is just a mater of political nuances'</i>. The author concludes that the demand for the referendum in the RS reveals the real image of BiH, which has returned from its Dayton to a pre-war phase.</p>

<p>Int press: Montenegro vote spurs Bosnia Serb referendum calls</p>	<p><b>Washington Post</b> and <b>New York Times</b> by <u>Olga Lola Ninkovic</u> – The WP and NYT carry the report by Reuters which comments on the statements by the RS Prime Minister <b>Milorad Dodik</b> on allowing this entity to organize the referendum and the petition supporting this stance and separation allegedly signed by 50.000 people. Noting that the HR <b>Christian Schwarz-Schilling</b> stressed on Monday that <i>“BiH is not in question now or in the future”</i>, <u>Ninkovic</u> further stressed that the Serb National Movement gained popularity after Montenegro voted for independence and after Dodik poured fuel on the fire. Noticing that Montenegro was one of Yugoslav federal republics and that Kosovo [though still a province of Serbia] is under UN control, author stressed that Dodik’s proposition for BiH to be organized, as federal unit is a recipe the European Union fears would lead to endless Balkanization. <b>Der Standard</b> – Vienna based daily also carried the agencies report on Dodik’s statements, SPONA initiative and the HR’s stance.</p>

It is a clear warning that Bosniak parties want to take full control of the area that was usually considered to solely belong to Croat parties"*, stressed HDZ leader, and continued: *"Therefore, we would have to find different modalities in order to avoid the possibility that – for example – SDA or some other Bosniak party appoint the Croat member of BiH Presidency"*. However, Covic emphasized that HDZ once again expects convincing victory within the Croat election body, *"which means over 100,000 votes"*. Regarding the newly formed HDZ 1990 party, Covic stated that – although it's up to the BiH Central Election Commission to decide – this party would certainly have to register for the coming election under some different name. *"First of all, because they falsified all the documents they have submitted – they only copied the documents of the HDZ and added four numbers, and that is why we have filed a lawsuit against them...
