Update: Covic removal, Tadic case / Indictment vs. Dokic

S. – Removed member of the BiH Presidency, **Dragan Covic**, BiH Constitutional Court President **Mato Tadic**, four of the **Ivankovic-Lijanovic** brothers and university professor **Zdravko Lucic** pleaded not guilty before the BiH Court on Wednesday on charges of misuse of office, tax evasions and receiving bribe in 'Lijanovici' case. Covic described the entire process as politically manipulated. Judge Swanson warned him that he should not speak about the motives of the other side at this stage of the process.

Hayat, PINK – The defence lawyers objected that the prosecution has not submitted them with all the evidences in the case, which refers especially, as Dragan Covic's lawyer, **Josip Muselimovic**, stated, to the testimonies by the protected witnesses. The judge rejected these requests, saying that the Prosecution has presented even more evidences than necessary. Muselimovic speculated that there are six protected witnesses, to which Prosecutors hesitantly answered that there are several witnesses but refused to disclose their number in public. *"It is obvious that someone opposes the idea of having Serbs, Croats and Muslims together in BiH. I think that the process has political background"*, said **Mladen Ivankovic Lijanovic**. Lawyers should file appeals by April 15, while BiH Prosecution should respond to those by April 25.

Raguz also said that there is still a crisis in the BIH Council of Ministers, adding that the recent decisions made by HR Paddy Ashdown made the situation even more complex. Raguz said that the question was raised to which point HR could interfere with the work of top BIH institutions and their high officials. <i>“These decisions were imposed and I personally believe that they are not the best,”</i> said Raguz.</p>

<p>Ints/ with Ashdown: I was not too soft on Covic</p>	<p>Hayat by <u>Adnan Rondic</u> – In an interview for NTV Hayat, the HR Paddy Ashdown was asked whether he was too soft on Covic to which he responded that he gave enough time to Covic to bring decision himself in dignity. <i>“The decision was brought by all International Community representatives. IC has clearly stressed that it would be impossible to cooperate with person [dealing with foreign policy] due to the indictment raised. The decision is based on a standard practice which has been applied in many other cases in BiH. I brought the decision with deep regret, but because it was necessary. I had no other possibility. Whether the decision opposes the Constitution, as Covic claims, is not true, but if he wants to deny it I told him that he could present the issue to BiH Constitutional Court. If the Court is to bring such decision, I would withdraw mine, but I am pretty sure that something like that is not going to happen”</i>, said Ashdown.</p> <p>Dnevni List, pg 5, mentioned on front ‘It would be unjust to ban Covic from political engagement’, by <u>Danka Polovina-Mandic</u> – DL also carries an interview Ashdown, on Covic’s removal. According to DL's source in the HDZ BiH, Covic's faction in the HDZ received HR Ashdown's support for the appointment of Barisa Colak to the BiH Presidency, which is very important for the faction to secure domination in the party and on top of that the HDZ would gain extra popularity among the electorate. SIPA takes over 'Krimolovci' hotline for reporting info on PIFWCs, organized crime

RHB, PINK, Hayat, Dnevni Avaz pg 3 'Terzic: SIPA takes over the fight against the organized crime', mentioned on cover, by M. Drinjakovic, **Oslobodjenjej** pg 8 'Hotline for hunt on war criminals' by Az. K., **Dnevni List**, pg 4 'Krimolovci under SIPA competence', by M. Zorlak, **EuroBlic** RSpg 3 'Hunter of Hague fugitives' by SRNA, **Nezavisne Novine** pg 8, announced on cover 'SIPA took over "Crime catchers"', **Nezavisne Novine** pg 8 'Citizens may deliver information on war crimes' by M. Cubro – On Wednesday, the EUPM handed over the "Krimolovci" [Crime-Catchers] telephone line to the SIPA. At the same time, the line will also be available for offering not only the information on the organized crime, but also on the Hague indictees to the agency. *"I hope that SIPA will show that it is a serious agency for implementing law and that it is ready to deal with crime and all other means of endangering security of BiH citizens,"* stated the Chair of the BiH Council of Ministers **Adnan Terzic** at the ceremony. The HR Paddy Ashdown at the occasion underlined that the police cannot be successful unless citizens were not ready to support its work by offering information. *"One of the problems that the citizens still do not trust politicians and institutions is the fact that in the past there were too many close relations between political and criminal circles,"* said Ashdown. The EUPM Commissar, **Kevin Carty** called on all citizens to use the line and report any criminal activity. **Dnevni Avaz** pg 3 'Serious test for SIPA' op-ed by Mersiha Drinjakovic – Referring to the transferring of the responsibility for Krimolovci hotline to SIPA, the author notes that this marked the beginning of SIPA's effort to carry out its mandate.

FTV by Dzenana Zolota – FTV aired highly critical report on the ceremony, saying that the HR Ashdown denied he ever stated that there is a close relation between politicians and crime. FTV further demanded from Terzic to comment to such claim, to which Prime Minister reacted very harshly saying that he believes that *"it is pure stupidity"*.

<p>Dodik: Karadzic stole 37 million KM from RS in 1997</p>	<p>Dnevni Avaz cover splash, pg 5 'Karadzic stole 36 million KM' by <u>Edina Sarac</u> – In an interview to DA, the leader of SNSD, Milorad Dodik, stated that <i>"there are documents proving that Radovan Karadzic walked out from the RS Peoples Bank in Banja Luka with the bag carrying amount of 36 million KM in spring 1997."</i> Dodik adds that at the time, the head of the Government was Gojko Klicakovic, who was under Karadzic's control. Asked why he did not file the charges regarding this case since he possesses evidences, Dodik responds: <i>"I understand that at the time there were a lot of Karadzic's people incorporated in the authorities and there was no enough power to solve this... Also, when I was the Head of the Government, judges were those appointed by Karadzic. That lasted almost until 2002."</i></p>

<p>BHT 1 feature on Srebrenica working group</p>	<p>BHT 1 by <u>Zoran Sarenac</u> – The RS Government’s working group completed the analysis of the documentation gathered by Srebrenica Commission. The Working group’s report contains the names of persons involved with the war crimes in Srebrenica. Some of them, says BHT 1, are still performing the duties of the officials or employees in RS institutions. The report will be delivered to the State Prosecutor and to the High Representative. <i>“We came to significant research results, which, together with documents of the Srebrenica Commission, represents reliable base for activities in jurisdiction of the BiH Prosecutor’s office,”</i> said member of the working group, Smail Cekic. RS President, Dragan Cavic, said that he is still not familiar with the report of or with names presented in it. The complaints are mostly related to authorities at the local and cantonal level as well as to inspection services.

SDHR Wnendt writes: *"(...)These kinds of proposals would be a divisive move and would not warrant a solution in the context of public broadcasting reform, which must ensure that the cultural, religious and linguistic diversity of the country are fully safeguarded. On 1 February the Council of Ministers endorsed the PBS System Law and accordingly forwarded it to parliamentary procedure. What are the specific implications that this law may have on the interests of the Croat people? (...) In contrast to private broadcasters the public broadcaster would have to satisfy all elements and interests of society. The law requires the broadcasters to pay specific heed to the interest and culture of all constituent peoples. Programs shall be broadcast equally in the three languages of BiH and should ensure equal representation of the culture and traditions of all three constituent peoples. ."*
