Lozancic on Prce's
pardon

FBiH President **Niko Lozancic** stated on Friday that his decision on granting pardon to **Miroslav Prce**, former FBiH Defence Minister, is legally and constitutionally grounded. He added that this decision was an act of mercy and it has nothing to do with Prce's political, national or any other orientation.

Lozancic underlines that he issued several decisions on granting pardon in the past period, only the one in relation to Prce attracted attention of public and many *"defendants of moral, legal and all other principles, often promoted without arguments"*. He also mentioned Head of the Office for Corruption and Organized Crime within BiH Prosecution, **John McNair**, as the one who reached bargain with Prce on 5 instead of 15 years in prison, however, according to Lozancic none paid attention to that. In relation to the OHR and the High Representative **Paddy Ashdown**, Lozancic says that Ashdown cannot stand easily when someone has a different opinion from his own. *"I know that they are conceited and vengeful, and I know that I can expect a new campaign against my next possible decisions on any issue..."* said Lozancic. He added: *"I claim that the medical reports, on the ground of which I have decided to pardon Prce, are absolutely valid... I have to say that after the 'mess' which has been caused, I am sorry for not having Prce's sentence more radically reduced."*

<p>OHR on Lozancic's stand on Prce's pardon</p>	<p>FTV – The OHR commented that Niko Lozancic has a right on his own opinion and that the fact is that existing law allows granting of pardon without any explanations. Still, 48 out of 225 requests for pardon were approved this year in the RS, while 94 requests were approved in the FBiH out of 298, which were filed. The OHR pointed out that this is not about granting pardon to Prce, but it is about the system that allows making of such decisions without control and which has to be reviewed.</p>

DA inset 'Hadzipasic: I want Nadarevic and Lucic to stay' carries FBiH Prime Minister Ahmet Hadzipasic as saying: 'Personally, I wish that Naradevic and Lucic stay in the FBiH Government. I do not participate in the procedure of decision-making on resignations, however, the Ministers are being appointed at the Prime Minister's proposal and I have not been involved in this process in any way yet.'</p>

<p>Lozancic against Law on inspections in FBiH</p>	<p>NTV Hayat, Dnevni Avaz pg 5 'Without signature on Law on inspections' <u>not signed</u> – At the press conference, held on Friday, FBiH President Niko Lozancic stated that he rejected to sign a decree on declaration of the law on inspections in FBiH, by saying that the law had not been brought in line with the constitutional procedure. Namely, the law has been adopted by both Houses but with different texts.</p>

State Ministry of Agriculture must be established next year	<p>BHT 1- by <u>S. Lisica</u> – Goran Perkovic, RS Minister of Agriculture said that the RS does not support establishing of the State Ministry or creating laws in the agriculture sector at the state level. BHT 1 says that the department for agriculture is established, within the BiH Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Relations, where just three persons are employed. As for technical assistance, the EC approved 1 million KM to this department.</p> <p><i>“Entities’ authorities must transfer capacity to the state level as soon as possible. If this don’t happen and the BiH Ministry is not established by September next year, BiH will lose support of the EC and advantages for this sector.”</i> Kjartan Bjorson (SP), EC representative stated.</p>
‘Dom’ to hold protest in front of FBiH Parliament on Tuesday	<p>Dnevni Avaz pg 8 ‘Association ‘Dom’ announced protest just in case’ by <u>S.S.</u>, Dnevni List pg 4 ‘Protests of ‘Dom’ association announced’ <u>not signed</u> – The Association of tenancy right holders over nationalized and private flats ‘Dom’ announced a peaceful protest that is to take place on Tuesday in front of the FBiH Parliament when the FBiH Parliament is supposed to discuss a change to the law which would make possible purchase of the nationalized flats.</p>

Kurtovic</u> learns that if the negotiations on the police reform fail Chairman of the BiH Council of Ministers Adnan Terzic will resign and SDA would like to see current BiH Minister of Human Rights and Refugees Mirsad Kebo at his position. The Osl. source says that Terzic's removal will take place even if Terzic was against it. People from SDA claim that Terzic will even try to present a failure as a success and that he will try to preserve his position in all possible ways. DA inset 'I will not submit resignation' carries Terzic as saying that he is not intending to submit the resignation even if the police reform talks fail since he has given his best to make these talks successful.</p>

During the recess, requested by the SDA and SDP, a session of the Assembly Collegiums was held, during which Avdic's statement was condemned. The Collegiums also adjourned the session and decided to inform the BiH Electoral Commission and international organizations of the incident.</p>

<p>BiH should get Law on PBS by mid September/On payment of RTV subscription</p>	<p>BHT 1 – <u>by M. Boskovic</u> – BiH should get a final Law on Public Broadcasting System (PBS) by mid September, when the BiH House of Peoples (HoP) should vote on it. According to the leading political parties, the Law will be adopted at the session on September 15th along with over-voting HDZ delegates. <i>“Knowing the Constitutional Court judgment, it is realistic to expect that we will adopt the Law in mid September, which is good. BiH needs this Law.”</i>Tomislav Limov, President of PBS legal constitution Commission, stated. <i>“You know that Constitutional Court had made decisions that failed in Strasbourg. We will use this instance and then we will see what happens”</i> Anto Spajic, HDZ delegate in BiH HoP stated. The FBiH Government must discuss the BiH Telecom’s request for cancelling theContract on collection of RTV tax through phone bills.<i>“I think that RTV tax payment through BH Telecom bills is not the best solution. If we privatize Telecom operators, will it survive?,”</i> Nedžad Brankovic, FBiH Minister of Traffic and Communication stated. BiH Council of Ministers excludes possibility of the contract cancelling. The Law on PBS clearly defines that in next 5 years operators of Telecom are collecting RTV tax. <i>“If implementation of the law starts, this will be an additional obligation to the Telecoms. I expect that they will increase provision on tax payment.”</i> Branko Dokic, BiH Minister of Communications and Transport stated.</p>
