Cavic continues with negotiations on new PMdesignate and RS Govt

Diklic</u> – Following the consultation meetings with RS political parties, the RS president Dragan Cavic stated that he has no parliamentary majority for any potential solutions over the new prime minister-designate. He told reporters that talks with the parties in the RS parliament will resume and that he will name the PMdesignate by January 8. He will also send a letter to political parties in RS for which could in this moment nominate PM-designate and win parliamentary majority. Cavic deems that the best solutions is for the new government to consist of six strongest political parties in RS – SDS, SNSD, PDP, SP RS, DNS and SRS - which would provide proposals for ministers from Bosniak and Croat people. Cavic announced negotiations for Tuesday with Party for BiH, SDA and SDP, as well as a special meeting with opposition leader Milorad Dodik. BHT 1 - Cavic still believes that the PM-designate should be appointed from a smaller political party, such as DNS. He says that all 6 major political parties should participate in the new government. "We are going to discuss all possibilities, and I do not want to go into details; I think that the best thing would be to establish the government with representatives of all 6 political parties, especially representatives of two strongest ones. I think that political issues we are facing are such in which we do not need strong opposition, but strong consolidated political activities."

FBiH Association of de-certified Police officers want MPs to initiate revision of certification process **Dnevni List**, pg 2 'Minister Halilovic proposes anti-constitutional law', by Erna Mackic -According to the President of Association of de-certified Police officers of FBiH, Ramo Sulic, the Proposal of law on Police officials, the proponent of which was the FBiH Interior Minister, Mevludin Halilovic, contains anti-constitutional and discriminatory provisions. Sulic says that Halilovic calls upon BiH's international obligations, whilst in the same time neglecting provisions of the European convention on human rights and freedoms, which resulted in de-certified officers not getting the right to prove their innocence, unlike war crimes suspects who have that opportunity. DL also reports that the Association addressed the MPs in the FBiH and BiH Parliaments, who have been asked to amend the Law on Police officials in FBiH and BiH. On top of this, the MPs will be asked to initiate the process of revision of certification process.

#### Update to dismissed OSA personnel

Nezavisne Novine cover and pg 5 'Agents suspected of illegal tapping remain at work at OSA' by <u>M. Cubro</u> – *NN* claims that Almir Dzuvo, OSA Director, has violated conclusions of the

BiH Parliament, which demanded that intelligence officers suspected of illegal tapping in "coup d'etat" affair should not be working at OSA. According to **Tihomor Gligoric**, Chairperson of the BH Parliament Investigation Commission on coup affair said the Commission had demanded this following the hearing of those involved in the affair. Tomislav Limov, Chairperson of the Parliamentary Board for surveillance over OSA work, said that: "I do not know who was dismissed and why. We will wait for 15 day deadline (stipulated to filing the motions) expires and then we would check as to why each of candidates was dismissed. Investigation is taking place against those involved in tapping affair. The results of this proceeding would be above decision of the OSA Director, and I believe he would have to respect these decisions." Sarac - DA brings the source from OSA who says that this same situation occurred when [former intelligence services] SNS and AID were

merged, and 200 people where dismissed then.

dismissed from OSA as of 31<sup>st</sup> December 2004. One of them, Predrag Ceranic, claims that the leadership of the Agency preserved at work

only compromised personnel, involved in creation of terrorist camps, while the others with clear files lost the job. Mile Medjed, formerly Head of Prijedor OBS Centre, also claims that the process of dismissal is of

political nature, stressing that "many criminals and candidates for the Hague stayed working at OSA". Mladen Cucun is also critical of the OSA Commission work for selection of staff, questioning as to how it is possible that the Commission could have checked on each of over 1000 employees at OBS and FOSS for only 100 days. He concludes that superficial selection process speaks for itself.

**RTRS** <u>by Pejka Medic</u>– RTRS also carries comments by Medjed, Ceranic, and Cucun. They all stressed that they meet all criteria for

OSA and therefore do not understand dismissals. Former OBS [former RS intelligence service] high ranking officials also didn't make it into OSA. Reporter comments that their dismissal is connected to SDS-PDP conflict regarding key positions in RS MoI, intelligence services and the Security Ministry. Reporter concludes that dismissed workers who were contacted by RTRS today announced lawsuits in the matter.
