## Spiric: Cavic's talks with parties unserious

FTV - "SNSD will not participate in the talks with President Cavic in relation to re-distribution of authorities, in relation to his so-called "concentration Government". RS officials have not gave up on a position to preserve entities MoIs. "Commission's Chairman submitted three proposals to the High Representative and the HR currently reviews these. None of those three proposals foresees further existence of the entities' MoIs.
