Agreement on dual citizenship between BiH and Croatiainitialed

Oslobodjenje cover splash, pgs 4-5 'Instead of Prime Ministers, Ministers signed agreement' by Aldijana Omeragic - BiH delegation lead by the Prime Minister, Adnan Terzic, on Thursday initialed an agreement on dual citizenship with Croatia. Even though it was expected for Terzic and Croatian Prime Minister, Ivo Sanader, to initial agreement, this was done by the BiH Civil Affairs Minister, Safet Halilovic and Croatian Interior Minister, Ivica Kirin. As for the agreement on property relations not initialed due to RS objections, Sanader and Terzic stressed that that progress on this issue could be achieved in the fall. Terzic, who visited Sanader officially for the first time, said that it was unacceptable for two countries to have been preparing these agreements for past 13 years, adding "that we cannot think of European integrations if we, as the closest neighbors, are not able to resolve property issues." Asked by the journalists why is RS against the agreement, Terzic said that "all this has been politicized" and that "RS fears it will have no enough money to pay its obligations." "I believe we can sing this agreement very soon, during my visit to BiH [in fall]," said Sanader. He also noted to Terzic that in discussing the constitutional changes in BiH, authorities must ensure the equal rights of Croats are guaranteed.

FTV - "The most relevant opinion is the one of the RS Administration for Geodetic and Property issues, and [they] have endorsed the agreement. Everything else is most likely the result of anxiety and fear whether we would have sufficient funds. But [this]... should not be the reason for not signing the agreement... We are going to have the open talks in BiH [on this issue] ," stated Terzic. "It is extremely important document for both countries. The preparations on the property-legal affairs agreement took almost 10 years, it seems that the Governments of these two countries haven't finished it, but we have. Now, what they see or what anxiety or fear they feel, they have to deal with it themselves. And of course BIH has to solve the issue,Croatia is prepared to sign the agreement that will benefit both sides" said Sanader.

Procedure for protection of vital national interest on 5 laws adopted by the RSNA to be launched

DA interview: Tihic on appointments in state institutions, situation in BiH CoM, police reform, argues that HR Ashdown lost resoluteness Dnevni Avaz, front pg splash 'Ashdown has lost resoluteness' and pg 5 'Nobody serious in SDA considered removal of Terzic', by Admir Malagic – Carries an interview with the Bosniak member of BiH Presidency and President of SDA, Sulejman Tihic, in which he talks about several topical issues. Commenting on the appointment of leadership of the

State Border Service, Tihic argues the post of the SBS Director should be given to the Bosniaks,

saying it would be a mistake if the High Representative or someone else took a different decision. In this context, Tihic says there should be an agreement on distribution of posts in the SBS, noting that prior to that agreement, there should be a new agreement on distribution of posts in the SIPA, OSA and (BiH) MoD. Commenting on the situation in the BiH Council of Ministers, Tihic says it is the Chair of BiH CoM, Adnan Terzic, who should be facilitating an agreement (about the BiH CoM). However, Tihic reckons that the parties from the RS are not keen on reaching an agreement, which makes it a difficult task for Terzic. Furthermore,

Tihic says no serious politician in the SDA is thinking about replacing Terzic with someone else. "It would not be politically wise or good for the state and the party to change the Chairman of BiH CoM in the crisis situation", says Tihic. Asked to comment on the course of police reform, Tihic says it is a waste of time to discuss the crisis at the level of entity government, which in fact shows the lack of resoluteness on part of the IC. Responding to the journalist's remark that HR Paddy Ashdown's reaction after the (last) Sarajevo meeting (on police reform) was too mild, Tihic says that HR Ashdown's reactions have become weaker ever since December, since the NATO summit, when everybody expected sanctions against obstructionists to the BiH's European path. "I think that his (Ashdown's) lack of resoluteness is a consequence of lack of resoluteness by the IC", says Tihic.

Underground chambers and corridors were built for secret operations," a well-informed source told Monitor. Allegedly the building in Jovanj do was even hidden from the Serbian Orthodox Church clergy and many of them who serve in Ostorg have never set foot in the underground rooms. Karadzic is allegedly hiding in various churches and often moves from one to another. The foreign media previously reported that he is hiding in Montenegro and eastern Hercegovina dressed in an Orthodox priest's robe. "We know nothing about the speculation that Karadzic is hiding in Montenegro and that his arrest is being planned," Monitor was told by a source in the Hague tribunal.
