BHT - SDA believes that the cooperation with ICTY could be improved if new RS Minister of Interior would be a Bosniak and at the same time the RS Prime Minister announced that new Minister would be appointed soon. However he did not say who that might be.SDA thinks that one of two key positions in RS MoI should be given to Bosniaks, place of Minister or of a Director of RS Police. "First of all that has to be very experienced politician, a professional in Police sector, and the one who enjoys strong support of RS Government and RSNA majority," said Tarik Sadovic from SDA. "Who ever is the Minister his first responsibility will be fulfilment of obligations toward ICTY"- said Dragan Cavic, RS President. Even though, according to some sources close to RS PM Dragan Mikerevic, best chances for the appointment has the current BiH Military Attache in Brussels Darko Matijasevic, Mikerevic still keeps quiet. "I hope that I will soon have the opportunity to announce that name," said Mikerevic.

Doboj PSC announced that "Sjencic and **Radulovic** were injured in the heads in the fight. The investigation o this event is still ongoing." Sjencic says thathe and Gojkovic were leaving the Municipal building when a Mercedesstopped, from which Gojkovic, Jevtic and Misic stood out. He further said: "Gojkovic hit me with the gun in the head." He noted **Gojkovic** was bothered with the fact two of them were wearing Tshirts with SNSD signs. According to him, **Gojkovic** said that he is still

"lord and master of this city."

## Update to work of entity Commissions for search after missing persons

**Glas Srpske** pg 5 'Wardens of false pictures' by <u>N. Zelenovic – GS</u> carries reports with comment of Slobodan Skrba, member of the RS Commission for search after missing persons, who denied all accusations of his colleagues from F BiH (that Serb side is abusing human remains). Skrba claims that it is actually the opposite as F BiH Commission claims, meaning that Federal authorities have been deliberately hiding, for years now, information related to missing Serbs, including sites where they were buried and re-location of graves. He further adds that Federal Commission has been lately deliberately postponing DNA analysis of human remains, in order to keep the false picture pf Bosniaks are major victims during the past war in BiH. Skrba also says that Federal Commission used to exchange the bodies of the Serbs from Sarajevo , murdered Sarajevo camps, for the bodies of at the F BiH Army soldiers. He also accused Federal Commission of having re-located mass and individual graves during and shortly after the war, by which it has covered the traces of crimes committed.

Nezavisne Novine op-ed pg 7 'Ethnic telecom operators' by <u>M. Cubro</u> – The author is writing about "BH Telekom" starting the op-ed with the statement that Hamdo Katica, Director of "BH Telekom" has the (monthly) salary of BAM 8.5 thousand, but the services of the company he is running are as bad as his salary is. The author claims "BH Telekom" is nowadays vastly lagging behind other two operators in BiH (Telekom Srpske and Eronet), in regard to favourable services it is providing

#### to its users.

<u>Cubro</u> further notes that the three telecommunication operators in BiH have been ethnically divided, substantiating it with the reference to a statement a senior official of the SDA made few months ago that third GSM licence would be allocated to Mostar HT, so that "Bosniaks, Serbs and Croats have their

### operators".

The author further claims that SDA has placed Katica to this position at "BH Telekom", noting that SDA is still running the policy of holding the monopoly, in order to keep this company and its income under its control. He concludes the article by saying: "The authority has failed to do anything to change the situation at these firms. Does not this substantiate proof that the power-holders are those making the best benefit of the chaos. It is logical that when the authority makes the money, the citizens are losing it."

Vecernje Novosti cover and pg 2 'We were about to go bankrupt' by Slobodan Pesevic - In a brief interview to VN, Dragan Mikerevic, RS Prime Minister, says that "regardless of the fact progress has been achieved in some areas, we have failed to achieve the desired progress. All departments of my Government have not, unfortunately, contributed to the same extent. We have several problems piling up, and if we fail to resolve them, they might escalate. Hearby I refer to urbanism and housing problem." He also expresses dissatisfaction with the process of privatisation and something would have to be changed in this regard. He denies speculations regarding the abolishment of RS Interior Ministry. On appointment of new RS MoI, he expresses hope he would appoint Minister during the course of next week. On removal of SDA ministers from RS Government, he says that he was satisfied with their work, noting that "we have not had any major problem, but instead some democratic debates at Government sessions." He adds that "I must take care of Government stability. I will make a move in the coming ten days or so to calm down political tensions."
