Update to Terzic-Sanader meeting, Cavtat hospital

Terzic and Croatian Prime Minister Ivo Sanader discussed issue of Ploce port, sale of the children's hospital in Cavtat and other economic issues. Ratko Macek, Spokesman of Croatian Government confirmed that Croatia is willing to redefine agreement on Ploce port. New agreement will not jeopardize BiH's special status in the Port. Sanader and Terzic discussed the issue of children's hospital in Cavtat, which is the property of Sarajevo University Clinical Centre. According to unofficial information, the sale has been ceased for Croatian authorities to consider complaints of BIH authorities. Terzic and Sanader discussed the agreement on property relations and management of Trebisnjica electricity plant and Bucko lake. This has been a preparatory meeting for Terzic's upcoming official visit to Zagreb. **Dnevni List**, pg 5 'New agreement on Ploce Port being

"Joint stance is that there must be signing of the agreement between BiH and Croatia, which will regulate the property-legal relations between two countries. OHR agrees that signatories of the Succession Agreement must respect it completely and it should be above any law, whether herre or in Croatia," stated Miletic following the meeting.

Adoption of the Law on stabilization and accession agreement in delay

Update to Rajo Krsmanovic trial [acid acetic anhydride affair]

FTV, RTRS, Nezavisne Novine, pg. 6 '13,3 tons of heroin could have been produced out of the imported acetic acid anhydride' by A. Durmo, Glas Srpske, pg. 10 'Regularly over the border' by N. Zelenovic - Trial to Rajo Krsmanovic, theaccused of importing vinegar acetic acid anhydride to produce heroine, has continued on Wednesday. Main proceeding has been postponed to 19 October, as the first Prosecution witness RS Health Minister Marin Kvaternik could not be present at the court. Chemical engineer Nedzad Vejzagic who works in the FBIH Interior Ministry confirmed that when the import was made BIH didn't have the necessary legislation to control it. Court expert Hilmija Masovic stated that the packages of vinegar acid examined were not corresponding to the labels on the packages. Masovic revealed the information that out of 1kg of anhydride mixed with other substances it is possible to produce 1,804 grams of heroin. Defence attorney Mithat Koco stated that there is no evidence that his client was selling the anhydrite to drug producers. To remind, in January this year it was published that BiH Prosecutor would investigate Rajo Krsmanovic from Bijeljina, one of the owners of "RBS Company", Bijeljina for importing 19.872.000 litres of acetic acid anhydride in November 2003. At the end of the month, he was arrested under suspicion of producing the heroin. The import of acetic acid anhydride and its use for drugs production were a major affairs in RS in the first half of the year.
