Humphreys: 'Europe is waiting for arrest of the Hague indictees'

Nezavisne Novine cover and pg 2 'Europe is waiting for arrest of the Hague indictees' - In a brief interview to NN, Michael Humphreys, the Head of EC delegation to BiH, expresses his belief that RS authorities will soon undertake activities aimed at arresting war crimes suspects. Owing to this reason, he does not exclude the possibility that the claims of some recently removed police officers of RS (referring to Dragan Lukac), that international community had given a list with three names of the Hague indictees to RS authorities, whom they need to arrest by Istanbul Summit of NATO are true. However, he does not want to talk about this in detail. On arrests he adds: "If I make a judgement based on experiences over the past few months, I am of the view that the authority officials, but also the people of RS are exhausted over this issue and they want it resolved once and for all. I believe it can be achieved. If pressure is exerted from all sides, it can be done. Can it be done by the end of June? I do not know that, but I hope it can."
