<p>EC to publish annual report on progress of countries that are candidates for EU membership</p>	<p><b>RHB</b> – With regard to publishing of an annual report on progress of the countries that are candidates and potential candidates for the EU membership, Head of the EC delegation <b>Michael Humphreys</b> will deliver the report for BiH to Chairman of the BiH Council of Ministers <b>Adnan Terzic</b>.</p> <p>The RHB also says that the EC is going to publish today a regular annual report on the progress of the countries that are candidates for the EU membership. It has been announced that the EC would adopt the final text of the report at today's session and the EU Commissioner for Enlargement <b>Oli Rehn</b> is going to present this report at the press conference scheduled after the meeting.</p>
<p>Serbian PM Kostunica scheduled to meet with RS officials in BL; delegation has still not arrived</p>	<p><b>RS Radio</b> – The Serbian delegation with <b>Vojislav Kostunica</b> leading it has not arrived as yet to Banja Luka , although the meeting between Serbian delegation and the most senior officials of RS was to take place at 11:00 hrs. According to report, the plane carrying Serbian delegation has not taken off as yet, while reasons for delay remain unknown.</p> <p><b>RHB</b> also announced the visit.</p>
<p>Mektic on newly formed Commission for revision of decisions on naturalization of foreign citizens</p>	<p><b>RHB</b> – Deputy BiH Security Minister <b>Dragan Mektic</b> stated that he expects that a newly formed state Commission for revision of the decisions on naturalization of foreign citizens unlike other Commissions, that were in charge of the same issue will finally bring this revision to an end.</p>

<p>FBiH HoP in session</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1</b> <u>Ljiljana Radl</u>, <b>RHB</b> – FBiH House of Peoples has continued its session started yesterday, discussing the rebalance of the FBiH budget for 2005.</p> <p>FBiH Finance Minister <b>Dragan Vrankic</b> addressed delegates explaining the reasons for the decision to redirect some money to the development of communications and traffic sector. However, HoP like the House of Representatives supported the stance that the purchase of airplanes for AirBosna company cannot be a priority over the benefits for persons whose disabilities are not consequence of war.</p> <p>As the proposal stipulates payments of these benefits retroactively as of 1 July, the FBiH Welfare Minister <b>Radovan Vignjevic</b> warned the implementation of such decision would be impossible as the end of year is very close. HoP is also expected to discuss the issue of co-capitalization of Energopetrol company.</p>
<p>Davidson urges for implementation of education reforms</p>	<p><b>BH Radio 1, RS Radio</b> – OSCE Head of Mission <b>Douglas Davidson</b> stated that BiH adopted the principles of the Bologna process and carry out necessary education reforms. As long as this is not done, the degrees awarded to BiH students will not be recognized internationally, stated Davidson following the meeting with RS National Assembly speaker <b>Dusan Stojicic</b> in Banja Luka today.</p>

<p>Igor Davidovic nominated for Chief BiH Negotiator with EU</p>	<p><b>RHB, Pink, BHT, Hayat, FTV, RTRS, Oslobodjenje</b> pg 7, mentioned on cover 'Nevertheless Davidovic nominated', <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4, <b>Vecernji List</b> pg 4 'Davidovic proposed to be chief negotiator' by <u>bs</u>, <b>Slobodna Dalmacija</b> pg 14 'Igor Davidovic best choice' by <u>A. Macanovic</u>, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 3, announced on cover 'Davidovic is a candidate for chief negotiator' by <u>V.Popovic</u>, <b>Glas Srpske</b> pg 3 'Davidovic is chief negotiator after all' by <u>Z.Markovic</u>, <b>EuroBlic</b> RSpg 1, announced on cover 'Igor Davidovic is negotiator with EU' by <u>Nedeljka Breberina</u> – RS President <b>Dragan Cavic</b> has nominated a candidate <b>Igor Davidovic</b> for the chief negotiator of BiH with EU on Stabilisation and Association Agreement (SAA). BiH Council of Ministers Chair <b>Adnan Terzic</b> is informed about this candidacy. Davidovic is former BiH Ambassador to USA. Cavic sad that, besides Davidovic's professional qualities, he chose him because he has the highest support of political parties in RS. <i>"My decision is based on my previously announced position that I will nominate for Chief negotiator a person for which there is a highest level of consensus in RS;"</i> said Cavic. Davidovic thanked Cavic and all others who supported him and underlined that his determination is BiH directed to integration instead of isolation. He expects that other candidates, who were mentioned these days as possible negotiators, join the negotiating team, stating that those persons have exceptionally high personal and professional reputation.</p>

<p>Party for BiH, SDP, HDZ on Chief Negotiator appointment</p>	<p><b>Hayat – Safet Halilovic</b> from Party for BiH said that the discussion on the chief negotiator took wrong turn. SDP leader <b>Zlatko Lagumdzija</b> speaking of the position of the chief negotiator said: <i>“This is, let’s say, a good technocratic even bureaucratic kind of job that requires not even minister’s rank of negotiators, not to speak about big parties leaders or similar. I think that Brussels looks at whole of this farce as at just another evidence of the mess in this country.”</i> HDZ’s <b>Vinko Zoric</b> commenting Davidovic being the chief negotiator said: <i>“My personal opinion is that this is not the first time when two obviously think they can agree without the third one. But that cannot be the obstacle to the BiH’s road to Europe.”</i></p>
<p>SNSD, SPRS, DNS, PDP on nomination of Davidovic</p>	<p><b>RTRS – Krstan Simic</b> from SNSD stated that this method of electing the Chief Negotiator has harmed RS. <b>Petar Djokic</b> from SPRS stated that Davidovic should have his place in the team and that he should not be treated as BIH messenger to EU. <b>Marko Pavic</b> from DNS stated that Chief Negotiator is not the most important person in the team but it is Chief of the Negotiating Team. <i>“I think that Cavic has already arranged with Chairman of CoM <b>Adnan Terzic</b> who will be the Chief of the Negotiating Team”</i> added Pavic. <b>Nevenka Trifkovic</b> from PDP stated that the political support to this team will determine the success of BIH in the SAA talks. Reporter stated that BIH CoM has officially accepted Davidovic as Chief Negotiator.</p>

Daily notes not a single political party expressed dissatisfaction over nomination. It also carries brief statements of SDS, <b>Milorad Dodik</b> from SNSD, <b>Zlatko Lagumdzija</b> from SDP of BiH, <b>Petar Djokic</b> from SP RS, <b>Marko Pavic</b> from DNS, welcoming nomination of Davidovic.</p>

<p>British Ambassador Rycroft says BiH can expect start of SAA talks in December</p>	<p><b>RHB, Pink, Hayat, FTV, RTRS, Oslobodjenje</b> pg 3 'BiH fulfilled a part of the deal', <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 4 'HR to lesser and lesser use his Bon powers', <b>Dnevni List</b> pg 6 'Beginning of negotiations between BiH and EU in December' <u>by M.B.</u>, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 3, announced on cover 'No new conditions for BiH' by <u>M.Cubro</u> – UK Ambassador to BiH <b>Mathew Rycroft</b> stated at the press conference in Sarajevo that he was informed by EU Foreign Affairs Ministers that BIH should start SAA talks as soon as possible. He added that BIH can expect to start SAA talks in December. Rycroft said that the speed of BIH integration solely depends on BIH Authorities. <i>"The speed by which BiH will get closer to the EU will depend solely on development of the state itself, in terms of how the agreed reforms will be implemented. It also depends on how much time would BiH need to secure the full cooperation with the ICTY and to become a fully functioning and sustainable state. In the event of major blockades on cooperation with the ICTY or police reform it will be possible to halt the process. And if the reform is being implemented rapidly it will be possible to move forward as quickly as possible, "</i> said Rycroft.</p>

R.</u> – At the session of Political Bureau of European Peoples' Party, PDP pleaded for <b>Christian Schwartz-Schilling</b> to be appointed new High Representative to BiH.</p>

<p>Humhreys on SAA talks, constitutional changes</p>	<p>Pink, RTRS – Head of the European Commission Delegation to BiH Michael Humphreys expressed satisfaction with the fact that the EU Council of Ministers accepted on Monday to start talks on the Stabilisation and Association Agreement (SAA). He hopes that negotiations might begin in December, if negotiating mandate is agreed on by the beginning of December. <i>“That would be a very positive move and I think e would show that BiH is entering into one very positive and progressive year,”</i> said Humphreys. He also underlined that RS have made a significant progress this year when it comes to cooperation with the ICTY and added that RS Government is responsible for that. He said that it is expected that remaining ICTY indictees still at large will handed over to the Hague tribunal during the coming months, Radovan Karadzic and Ratko Mladic before all others.</p> <p><b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 6 ‘Changes directed by BiH’, <b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 8 ‘IC will not be deciding on changes to the Constitution’, <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 5 ‘The International Community will not change BiH Constitution’ by <u>D. No one should think that Croatia wants to run away from the region. No, we want to cooperate with the region and our neighbours"</i>, said Mesic.</p>

<p>Tokic commenting on Igman Initiative session</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> cover pg splash 'To prevent enemies from representing the state' and pg 5 'To prevent enemies of BiH from representing the state' by A. Malagic – In a statement to daily, SDU's <b>Sejfudin Tokic</b> stated that, after Igman initiative session ended, one gets an impression that BiH Presidency has once again compromised the state, instead of promoting it. He noted he had got an impression during the session that SiCG President <b>Svetozar Marovic</b> and Croatian President <b>Stjepan Mesic</b> had showed more feelings and responsibility for the future of BiH than certain members of BiH Presidency. Tokic emphasized there are people sitting at the highest state institutions who have fought against BiH during the time of the aggression and have not changed their stance, therefore people must prevent – through next elections and constitutional changes – enemies of BiH from representing the state. Regarding the statement of <b>Borislav Paravac</b> who said certain stances presented during the session were unacceptable for Serbs, Tokic said Paravac had showed he is a follower of a modified policy of <b>Radovan Karadzic</b>. Inset 'RS cannot remain under this name' – SDU will demand through talks on constitutional changes for discrimination of other peoples in RS to be prevented and believes the entity can remain but not under this name.</p>

<p>Results of poll on police reform</p>	<p><b>RTRS, Glas Srpske</b> pg 5 'Majority supports the Government' <u>by D. Momic</u> – Prime Communications Agency has conducted a public opinion survey in RS on police reform in BiH. The results show 67,3% of citizens think police reform should be realized in frame of the entities, 61,2% of citizens think it would be more useful if RS Government respected the Constitution in the process of police reform, since this would have been in the interest of RS and its people, 64% of citizens supported the decision of RS Government not to adopt police reform concept that would include crossing of IEHL, 81,9% of citizens think MoI and police should continue to exist regardless of the police reform model while, with regard to whether a single police in BiH would do a more quality work than the current structures, only 14,8% of citizens think this would be the case while 57,7% of citizens think a single police would not show more quality work.</p>

BiH HoR adopts amendments to the Law on Citizenship

**RHB, Pink, BHT, Hayat, RTRS, Oslobođenje** pg 6 'Revision of naturalization of foreign citizens', **Dnevni Avaz** pg 10, **Dnevni List** pg 4 'Authority is preparing showdown with suspicious citizens' by D. Polovina-Mandic, **Vecernji List** pg 6 'As of 2006 list of all illegal citizens' by E. Medunjanin, **Nezavisne Novine** pg 6, announced on cover 'Commission for citizenship review soon' by M.Cubro, **Glas Srpske** pg 2 'Citizenship under review', **EuroBlic** RSpG 2, announced on cover 'Law on citizenship adopted' by S.D. – BiH House of Representatives has adopted in an urgent procedure the Proposal of the Law on amendments to the Law on Citizenship of BiH. Amendments and supplements is foresee forming the state commission for the revision of issued solutions on citizenship in the period from 6th April 1992 until the time when the Law on Citizenship of BiH was introduced. This Commission will have nine members, three international, while the decisions will be reached by consensus. *"This Commission would have possibility to deprive citizenship from persons for which is determined they used false documents or abuse the system in any way,"* said BiH Minister of Civil Affairs **Safet Halilovic**. He stated that this law is directed primarily to the citizens that are not from former Yugoslavia. There won't be possibility for appeal on Commission's decisions, but there is possibility for initiating administrative procedure. Exact number of citizenships issued in irregular way is not determined, but there is speculation that around 1000 foreign fighters get citizenships during the war. BIH HoR also adopted the law on indirect taxation in second reading.

Mandic</u> – HDZ MPs in BiH and FBiH House of Representatives issued a press release on Tuesday in which they gave their full support to <b>Martin Raguz, Bozo Ljubic</b> and <b>Josip Merdzo</b> and condemned the disciplinary measures that the HDZ Presidency has started against the troika. According to <b>Vinko Zoric</b>, (MP, also a member of HDZ Presidency) none of three of them have been working against interests of the HDZ and the Croat people, which is the reason why they do not deserve the treatment as 'prescribed' by the HDZ Presidency. <p>SD interview: Covic believes there will be no repeat of HDZ Convention</p>	<p><b>Slobodna Dalmacija</b>, pg 8 'No reasons to repeat Convention', mentioned on front 'New Convention of HDZ is cuckoo's egg', by <u>Marijan Sivric</u> – Carries an interview with the President of HDZ BiH, <b>Dragan Covic</b>, in which he mostly comments on the trip to Brussels and the meeting he had with the President of European People's Party, <b>Wilfried Martens</b>. Asked whether the EPP would stick to its earlier position that the HDZ Convention would have to be repeated, Covic says he does not believe it will be the case, arguing that the party can solve all pending issues within its own rank and in democratic way. He reiterates that the EPP has been submitted all the documents pertaining to the HDZ Convention and that Martens will visit HDZ on November 27.</p>

The HoP has also adopted amendments to Law on BiH citizenship. According to the amendments, state Commission in charge of reviewing decision on naturalization of foreign citizens in period of April 6<sup>th</sup>, 1992 – January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2006. Due to the fact that numerous citizenships were irregularly issued, BiH Minister of Civil Affairs **Safet Halilovic** said that all those who violated law were going to be sanctioned. The HoR has not adopted conclusions of BiH Constitutional-Legal Commission on proposal to draft of Law on higher education issued by HoR representative **Momcilo Novakovic**. *"The proposed law foresees RS in charge of higher education, while in terms of FBiH, authorities would be transferred from Cantonal to FBiH level, which we find unacceptable"*, said member of BiH Constitutional-Legal Commission **Filip Andric** and added that each nation should organize higher education as they believe it should be. BiH Ministry of Civil Affairs states that the Commission, led by the International Community, should be established in terms of higher education, as well.
