<p>NATO searches house of suspected Mladic's aide in Vlasenica</p>	<p>RTRS – This morning at about 07:30, NATO searched the house of Milisav Kljestan in Vlasenica, suspecting he has ties to the network supporting general Ratko Mladic. A press release issued by the NATO Headquarters Sarajevo reads: <i>"The search was done in order to gather additional information on the network and try to determine Mladic's location. The house was searched in line with NATO mandate to provide support to the ICTY regarding the arrest of persons indicted of war crimes."</i></p> <p>The press release further reminds of reward offered (of BAM 8.5 million) for any information regarding whereabouts of war crime suspects Radovan Karadzic, Ratko Mladic, Vlastimir Djordjevic, Goran Hadzic, Stojan Zupljanin and Zdravko Tolimir. Dragomir Peric, Spokesperson of Bijeljina PSC , confirmed that RS police was informed of NATO's action in Vlasenica, noting details and results of the investigation are to be made public by NATO Spokesperson. <p>Serbian police arrests suspected Mladic's aide in Belgrade</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – 30-day detention has been set against <b>Sasa Badnjar</b>, former RS office, in Belgrade on suspicion he has been aiding hiding of <b>Ratko Mladic</b>, Serbian media reported last night. Badnjar used to be member of security of Mladic. He was in charge of Mladic' communication, owing to which reason Serbian authorities believe they may get information regarding Mladic' whereabouts. <b>RHB, BH Radio</b> – also reported.</p>

<p>HR Schwarz Schilling to meet BH CoM Chair</p>	<p>RTRS – At today’s IO’s press conference, Ljiljana Radetic, OHR Spokesperson, has announced that the HR, Christian Schwarz-Schilling, is meeting today with the CoM Chair, Adnan Terzic. According to her, at this meeting, the HR will reiterate the fact that the SAA process is the most important issue now facing BiH. She also stated that: <i>“In his discussions this morning the High Representative will emphasize the crucial role of the Council of Ministers in maintaining the momentum of this process, in maintaining a creative and disciplined BiH negotiating stance, and in maintaining public support for the process, by ensuring that the people of BiH are informed about developments as they unfold. In addition to meetings with representatives of the authorities, the High Representative is also meeting a broad range of political leaders to discuss the overall political environment of BiH, including the importance of making this year’s election campaign issue-driven rather than personality-driven.”</i> RHB– also reported.</p> <p>RHB– BiH Council of Ministers at the session today would discuss Proposal of law on changes and amendments to law on criminal code of BiH, and Proposal of law on changes and amendments to VAT law.</p>

## Protests over caricatures in European press

Protests in Sarajevo over cartoons portraying Prophet Mohammed in European press; flags burnt, but no serious incidents

**Hayat**– On Wednesday, over 1000 persons protested over caricatures portraying **Prophet Mohammed** that appeared in the European press in front of the Danish, Norwegian and French Embassies in Sarajevo. Gathered citizens submitted the requests to French and Norwegian Embassies demanding explicit and public apology and sanctions for those responsible for publishing these drawings. **RTRS – Salih Begovic**, representative of protesters, called on boycott of products made in Denmark and other countries that published the cartoons. According to RTRS, demonstrations underwent in the downtown in peace, but protesters called Serbs, Jews and US President **George Bush** by offensive names. FBiH MoI spokesperson **Jusuf Zornic** said that protests ended without major incidents. As for two men who burnt the flags of Norway, France, Denmark and Croatia in front of the Norwegian Embassy and added that those who set fire to flags will be brought before the Law. **FTV –** Organisers of protests condemned burning of flags. **Dnevni Avaz** pg 13 'Freedom of expression comprehends obligations as well'- French Ambassador to BiH **Henry Zipper De Fabiani** stated that principle of press expression freedom should not be denied. BiH CoM expressed its regrets over the fact that the protests were aimed against neighbouring Croatia, noting its one was of the first countries which officials condemned the cartoons. <b>BHT1</b>– Commenting the protests, Chair of BiH Presidency <b>Ivo Miro Jovic</b> stated that everyone has the right to express disapproval in peaceful demonstrations. He called on the protesters in BiH to sustain from any violence. <b>PINK, RTRS, FTV</b>– carried Jovic. <b>RTRS</b>– BiH Presidency member <b>Sulejman Tihic</b> said that BiH citizens have right to show their disagreement. <b>Glas Srpske</b> cover pg splash 'For Allah against Vlachs' by <b>N.Z.</b> – While in Banja Luka, <b>Mladen Ivanic</b>, BH Foreign Minister, commented the protests in Sarajevo: <i>"I am of the view that protests are not necessary, but everybody has a right to express his/her view."</i> <b>Milorad Dodik</b>, SNSD President, told TANJUG news agency that protests throughout the world have obtained unnecessary character.</p>
<p>Croatian MoFA condemned burning of Croatian flag; Croatian Officials condemned the 'Nacional' publishing of caricatures</p>	<p><b>RHB, Dnevni List</b> pg 3 'Burning down of Croatian flag condemned' <u>not signed</u>– Croatian Foreign Ministry condemned events in Sarajevo during which Croatian flag was set on fire. The Croatian Government expressed the fact that Prophet Mohammed's caricatures were published in magazine 'Nacional', reiterating it has nothing to with the issue and condemning any kind of intolerance, said the Minister <b>Kolinda Grabar-Kitarovic</b>. Grabar-Kitarovic said she was sure that BiH authorities condemn the act. <b>Vecernji List</b> pg 2 'Croatian Embassy condemns incident' <u>not signed</u> carries that the Croatian Embassy in BiH condemned burning down of the Croatian flag. Also, the Croatian Embassy will not demand reaction of the BiH authorities, however it expects additional measures when security of their facilities in BiH is in question. <b>FTV</b> – Chair of Croatian Parliament <b>Vladimir Seks</b> and President <b>Stipe Mesic</b> harshly condemned the fact that the weekly magazine "Nacional" had published the caricatures showing Prophet Mohammed. Distributor of "Nacional" in BiH decided not to distribute the magazine in BiH, because of fear for security of its premises and employees. <b>BHT1, RTRS</b> – reported.</p>

**Reshuffling in entity governments**



<p>RS PM-designate Dodik: SNSD to get nine positions; PDP two ministries plus RSNA Speaker' position, SDP two positions; DNS, SDA, SP RS and SBiH one ministry each</p>	<p><b>RTRS</b> – According to media speculations, <b>Milorad Dodik</b>, RS PM-designate, already enjoys a support of 45 RS National Assembly representatives, defined program for the new Government and composition of the personnel even before the end of the consultations with political parties. Consultations are expected to finish by the end of week when PM-designate will ask for session of RSNA.</p> <p>New Government should be elected between February 20<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>. According to the RTRS, agreement on ministerial positions was achieved without much talk. Nine ministerial positions would go to SNSD, two Ministers and the RSNA Speaker would be from the PDP and DNS, while SDA, SDP, SP RS and SBiH would each get one ministerial position. <i>“Eight ministers would be from SNSD plus the Prime Minister, since it is a fact that SNSD bears responsibility for this Government and we... ask for support for this concept from everyone and I have to say that we did get that support”</i>, said Dodik.</p> <p><b>Mladen Ivanic</b>, PDP said that PDP would not ask more than PDP has a right to ask for if PM-designate wants party's support. <b>Marko Pavic</b> from DNS said that DNS asked for one ministerial position and one RSNA seat. <b>Predrag Kovacevic</b> from DSS said that DSS did not condition its support, and reporter comments they will probably ask for two RSNA positions. Club Centar is also expected to give support to Dodik. SDS and SRS will go to opposition. According to RTRS, no one from previous Government will sit in new Government, including Interior Minister <b>Darko Matijasevic</b> who after talks with RS President decided not to remain at the position although he was offered. RTRS also speculates that <b>Omer Brankovic</b>, SDA and <b>Slaven Pekic</b>, PDP might get ministerial positions again and that <b>Novak Kondic</b> or <b>Aleksandar Dzombic</b> might get position of Minister of Finance while DNS would nominate <b>Nedeljko Cubrilovic</b> for position of Minister of Communications and Transport.</p> <p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> cover splash, pg 2 'Dodik announces overthrowing of Terzic' by <b>N.Diklic</b>, <b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 5 'Republika Srpska gets new government', <u>not signed</u> – unlike the RTRS report, both DA and DL report that Dodik stated the SDP had been offered two ministerial positions in the new Government. <b>Hayat</b>, <b>RHB</b>, <b>BHT1</b>, <b>Oslobodjenje</b> pg 2 'Dodik offers ministry to SDA' by <b>O.V.</b>– carried similar reports.</p>

<p>SNSD to get ministries of internal affairs, education, health; PDP's Trifkovic to be new RSNA Speaker?</p>	<p><b>EuroBlic</b> cover pg splash, RSpG 1 'Key ministries to SNSD' by <u>Rajna Radosavljevic</u>, RSpG <b>Nezavisne Novine</b> pg 4 'Eight ministries to SNSD' by <u>V.Popovic</u> – Talking about possible composition of the new RS Government, <b>Milorad Dodik</b> said <i>"SNSD representative will be at MoI, since the fight against organized crime will be the priority of new Government."</i> He added SNSD staff would most likely be leading ministries of education and culture, health and social welfare. He stressed <b>Darko Matijasevic</b> and <b>Svetlana Cenic</b> will not be in the new government. <p>PM-designate Dodik announces overthrowing of CoM Chair Terzic; SDS to meet Dodik and talk about new RS Government</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> cover splash, pg 2 'Dodik announces overthrowing of Terzic' by <u>N.Diklic</u> – SNSD leader and RS Prime Minister designate <b>Milorad Dodik</b> stated for DA that he is not satisfied with work of BiH Council of Ministers, adding that he intends to call on reconstruction of this body. Commenting SDS's call on its representative ministers in the CoM and a suggestion for the SNSD and other parties which will form the new RS Government to fill in these positions, Dodik says that SNSD would never agree to having <b>Adnan Terzic</b> in the position of the CoM Chair. <i>"It is clear for a longer time that he has no support as the Chair. He should take a stance on this issue, and not act alike former RS PM <b>Pero Bukejlovic</b>,"</i> said Dodik. On Wednesday Dodik met with RS President <b>Dragan Cavic</b>, and he said that they only discussed the constitutional changes. <b>Borislav Bojic</b>, SDS Caucus chief in the RSNA, said that despite the decision of the Main Board delegation of this party would meet with Dodik on Sunday to discuss the position in the new Government, however he adds that he doesn't believe that party's stance would change. <b>Glas Srpske</b> pg 5 'Offer rejected' by <u>BETA</u>, <b>EuroBlic</b> RSpG 1 inset '<u>Matijasevic won't go with Dodik</u>' – also carries that Matijasevic rejected the offer for RS MoI.</p>

He is also skeptical of latest support expressed to Dodik by various political parties, his friends and so-called “friends”. He notes <b>Dragan Cavic</b> obviously proved not to be inclined to political suicide, proved by the fact he had proposed Dodik PM-designate. <p>SDS: CoM and BiH Parliament would not be affected by decision to cross to opposition</p>	<p><b>Hayat</b>– SDS Main Board announced on Tuesday that this party would go into opposition in RS National Assembly and BiH Parliamentary Assembly, and called on SDS Ministers in the BiH Council of Ministers to resign. As SDS leader <b>Dragan Cavic</b> said, SDS has no Ministers in the CoM, which means that no one could resign, says the reporter. <i>“We have two Ministers who are not members of SDS, but SDS proposed them and supported their proposal; these are BiH Justice Minister <b>Slobodan Kovac</b> and Defence Minister <b>Nikola Radovanovic</b>”,</i> said SDS’s <b>Bosko Siljegovic</b> and added that BiH would loose a lot if they resign. The fact that SDS is going into opposition will not affect the work of the BiH House of Representatives, in which there are 5 SDS members, says Siljegovic, but in terms of BiH HoP, SDS could block adoption of laws, still Siljegovic believes that it will not happen. <i>“HoP representatives are not being seen as some political parties’ representatives. I do not like being referred to as one political party representative”,</i> explains Siljegovic.</p>
<p>Kovac, Radovanovic believes their resignations would only deepen crisis in CoM</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 2 ‘Kovac: Demands for resignations not wise’ – SDS-supported BiH Ministers of Justice <b>Slobodan Kovac</b> and Defense <b>Nikola Radovanovic</b> believe that their withdrawal from the posts would only deepen crisis in CoM. Radovanovic said that he would decide on his possible resignation only after and if he receives officials SDS request. He however added that resignations would not be solution. Kovac also thinks that requests for his and Radovanovic’s resignations coming from SDS are not very wise. <i>“It would be better for politicians to turn to Europe than political games,”</i> said Kovac.</p>

<p>DL on SDS's decision to go into opposition: Blockade of BiH CoM come late February</p>	<p><b>Dnevni List</b>, pg 5 'Blockade of Council of Ministers to happen in late February', by <u>Ivica Glibusic</u> – commenting on the decision of the SDS Main Board to go into opposition in the RSNA and BiH Parliament and the request that the SDS-backed ministers in the BiH CoM resign, <u>Glibusic</u> reckons these are the signs of a big crisis at the state level, which will start in late February when a new RS Government is to be formed. <u>Glibusic</u> does not even rule out a possibility of a major crisis in the BiH Parliament that could lead to forming of a new majority or even organization of early elections. As for <b>Milorad Dodik</b> becoming a new RS Prime Minister, <u>Glibusic</u> believes it will bring nothing good to BiH since, according to <u>Glibusic</u>, Dodik proved to be <i>"harder than the radical SDS"</i> during the constitutional reforms talks.</p>
<p>DA op-ed: Demand for SDS-supported ministers to resign from BiH CoM is revenge to SDS leader Cavic</p>	<p><b>Dnevni Avaz</b> pg 3 'SDS' revenge to Dragan Cavic' <u>op-ed by Edina Sarac</u> – Commenting demand of SDS Main Board for the SDS-supported ministers in BiH Council of Ministers to resign, author says this is SDS revenge against party's President <b>Dragan Cavic</b>. Cavic himself would never demand these resignations due to his secret political agreements, reads editorial, adding that SDS has no intention to initiate crisis in BiH CoM, for they would have set official initiative if that was the case. Author also says that Cavic never managed to get full support in the party.</p>

<p>Solving of crisis through establishment of a ministry; Hadzipasic claims that crisis could have been avoided</p>	<p><b>Hayat</b>– Leading FBiH political parties [HDZ, SDA and SBiH] have agreed to solve the crisis they have created in FBiH through establishment of a Ministry. FBiH Prime Minister <b>Ahmet Hadzipasic</b> said that the issue could have been solved a long time ago, when the Law on Government was being changed. <i>“Dissatisfaction could have been stressed at that point, that ministry without portfolio should not be established; instead an operative ministry should be established. The error has been made, especially due to the fact that FBiH Ministry of Justice, with HDZ representative being the Minister, proposed the law. If there had been any misunderstandings, the Minister should have reported it and the whole issue could have been solved long time ago”</i>, said Hadzipasic. HDZ denies allegations on being responsible for the crisis by insisting on ministerial positions in the FBiH Government. <i>“If we had been interested in creation of crisis in the FBiH Government, we would have created it so far, the FBiH President could have dismissed the FBiH Parliament, the budget would be passed”</i>, said the Spokesperson to BiH HDZ <b>Miso Relota</b>. <i>“The OHR wants to see this issue solved as soon as possible in order for the Government to be established and for reform process to be continued without any obstacles”</i>, said the Spokesperson to OHR <b>Oleg Milisic</b>.</p>
<p>VL brings 4 possibilities for establishment of new FBiH Ministry</p>	<p><b>Vecernji List</b> pg 4 ‘Vrankic: Agreement on Ministry’ by <u>Z.K.</u> – FBiH Prime Minister <b>Ahmet Hadzipasic</b> and his Deputies <b>Gavrilo Grahovac</b> and <b>Dragan Vrankic</b> tried to agree on Wednesday night about establishing of a new Ministry that would practically replace the abolished FBiH Defence Ministry. VL also learns that HDZ President <b>Dragan Covic</b>, SDA President <b>Sulejman Tihic</b> and SBiH President <b>Safet Halilovic</b> agreed in principle that the solution should be found in the division of some of the current Ministries that cover a few areas and the FBiH Ministry of Urban Planning and Environment, FBiH Ministry of Energy Mining and Industry, FBiH Ministry of Development and Entrepreneurship and FBiH Ministry of Trade and Tourism were mentioned as possible solutions. VL says that Vrankic could not say which Ministry the FBiH Government would get and he judged that it is good to reach an agreement on this issue in order to resolve the crisis emerged due to non-adoption of the budget.</p>
