HR Ashdown criticizes BiH Presidency member Tihic for interference in civil service

Tihic's most recent comments concern appointments to SIPA (State Investigation and Protection Agency) and the State Border Service (SBS). Last year he sought to exert inappropriate political influence over appointments of judges and prosecutors, according to OHR. In his letter, the High Representative reminds Tihic that "appointments to the civil service, and – in these days when the world is concerned about the war on terrorism especially – appointments to security structures have to be conducted free of political *interference*". He added that interference by politicians in police and security appointments is completely inconsistent with European practice. "Politicians interfering in appointments in the police and security structures belong to communism and the past; it is completely inconsistent with Europe and the future," said the High Representative.

In fact, BiH Presidency member claims that Ashdown's associates are the ones who were interfering in the process of appointing the new SIPA director. "I have always supported the idea of having laws, professional criteria and standards respected," said Tihic. Tihic added that he was tasked by and has an obligation to the citizens who elected him to give opinions on appointment processes, even in cases when the HR makes the decisions on the particular appointments. Dnevni Avaz cover splash 'Heated correspondence between Ashdown and Tihic', pg 2 'My constitutional obligation is to voice my opinion on appointments, even in the occasions you do it too' not signed -Member of the BIH Presidency, Sulejman Tihic, sent a letter to the High Representative Paddy Ashdown denying accusations of politically influencing appointments in the state services. "It was never my intention to politically influence the process of appointments of either justices, prosecutors or other state servants, including security structures... However, the truth until now, and in a future, as a president of the strongest party and directly elected Presidency member, I have an obligation to voice my opinions, stances and comments to the process of appointments, including occasions in which you do the same... I have believed that some procedural discrepancies occurred in the process of appointing judges and prosecutor... I also believe, and I have warn you beforehand, that appointment of SIPA director was a mistake... [However] you can be certain I have not, nor I ever will, make political pressure in SIPA director's appointment process or in other security structures. However, political interference in process of appointing [current] SIPA director was done exactly by IC representatives, i.e. your colleagues."

## BiH Court's Kreso: Covic trials will have to be postponed

Kreso notes that Garlic resigned due to reasons of personal nature. She also notes that the 'Covic and others' case, which presided by Garlic and was scheduled to start on September 1, will have to be postponed because a new judge will have to familiarize with the case. The preparation of these laws and bylaws represents a part of process related to creation of the national strategy for the fight against terrorism. **Dragan Mektic**, BiH Deputy Security Minister, stressed: "Driven by global and permanent terrorist threats, we have commenced with preparation of the strategy for the fight against terrorism. This strategy will - in detail - work out what needs to be done by certain security agency and at certain threat level."
