Posters with offensive messages to Bosniaks and IC surface in west Mostar

Posters containing offensive messages to Bosniaks and the IC appeared throughout west Mostar early on Thursday. As reported by RTV Mostar, the posters were plastered late on Wednesday in the vicinity of Hotel Ero, which houses the OHR Regional Office. Right beside an SFOR advertisement "Here for peace" and "Here for BiH" is the slogan "Bosnia = Islam". Following the appearance, UN spokesperson Douglas Coffman stated that the messages were filled with ethnic hatred and anti-Dayton sentiments, which will not improve the atmosphere in west Mostar. He added that west Mostar has proven it does not

support the return of refugees and displaced persons.
