- One of five Mostar Croats indicted for war crimes, Zoran Soldo, surrenders to police
- BiH Federation police arrest action on Monday in west Mostar was in accordance with law and was not aimed against Croat people in general – <u>UN</u> spokesman Stefo Lehmann
- Only one of 12 persons arrested in Croatia on Tuesday was arrested at request of The Hague Tribunal – <u>ICTY</u> spokesman Paul Risley
