The [NATO](#) Permanent Council held a session to discuss the Kosovo issue in Paris. [NATO](#) official Klaus Naumann stated that [NATO](#) would not wait too long for Yugoslav President Slobodan Milosevic to join the negotiations. [NATO](#) Secretary General Javier Solana stated that the air-strikes on Yugoslavia are a

last resort and added that it is probable that Milosevic will force [NATO](#) to realize its threats by implementing military intervention. Kosovo Albanian delegation head Ibrahim Rugova was satisfied that the Kosovo side signed an agreement on a transitional solution and is convinced that the International Community and [NATO](#) will take concrete measures towards preventing further bloodshed.
