Krezo demands protection from SFRO pressure Ile Krezo asked the police for protection for his family from <u>SFOR</u> pressure after a parliamentary discussion on the <u>SFOR</u> training field Barbara in Glamoc. Krezo claims that <u>SFOR</u> "seized the land" without authorization.

"I say that this is a criminal act" he said. "I claim that the burning of houses in Glamoc two years ago was executed by <u>SFOR</u>." Barbara field is to be discussed at the 10th parliamentary session.
