Heads of states from around the world gathered in Rabat to attend the funeral of Moroccan King Hasan II.

US President Clinton met in Morocco with Israeli Premier Barrak and Palestinian leader Arafat. Details of this meeting were not published.

US Secretary of the State, Albright repeated that if Serbia wants any international aid, it has to get rid of Slobodan Milosevic. Severe condemnations of the recent massacre of 14 Serbs arrive from all sides, Serbian, KFOR and Albanian officials. The KLA refuted any responsibility for this massacre. KFOR initiated intensive investigation in order to apprehend and sentence the perpetrators.

Montenegro and its President, Milo Djukanovic will also take place in Stability Pact Summit, as observers. The RS MUP has formed the operation HQ for the summit in Pale, in order to provide safety for delegations that will reside in hotel capacities in Jahorina. Co-ordination between RS and Federation MUPs and <u>SFOR</u> is continued. About 75% of preparations for the Summit were already done.

BiH FA Minister Prlic met with US Ambassador to BiH, discussing the Stability Pact Summit preparations and meeting of political directors in Brussels. It was said that preparations for the summit are progressing well.

The traditional gathering of anti-fascists from 1941-1945 and 1991-1995 wars was organised by SDP at the hill of Srnice near Banovici, on the occasion of 58 years of BiH peoples' uprising.
