International Community representatives should react to Umicevic's open acts of discrimination — Party for BiH

"SFOR troops can be reduced only after all refugees in BiH are allowed to return home and after other goals of the <u>Dayton Agreement</u> are implemented" the Party for BiH concluded at a press conference in Sarajevo on Wednesday. The Party strongly condemned Banja Luka Mayor Djordje Umicevic's statement that rebuilding the Ferhadija Mosque will not be permitted.
