Interview with Meigs

In an interview with TV <u>SFOR</u>, <u>SFOR</u> Commander General Montgomery Meigs stated that "the recent attack on a house inhabited by <u>SFOR</u> soldiers in Zvornik clearly represents attempted murder" adding that, after an investigation, appropriate measures will taken. The incident was probably performed by a small group of terrorists trying to jeopardize peace efforts in BiH, while <u>NATO</u> strikes continue in Yugoslavia. Meigs believes politicians and political parties

in general understand that such actions, meaning violence, may be very dangerous and, in a local sense, could represent a threat to peace. He explained that a recent incident occurred near Rudo, when an SFOR patrol was illegally captured by the Yugoslav Army, represents an obvious encroachment on BiH sovereignty by Yugoslavia. He said this was a serious violation of the Dayton Agreement by Yugoslavia and announced that action will be taken to prevent such events.
