News Headlines:

- In late night decision, Yugoslav Constitutional Court President Srdic says that due to partial irregularities regarding voting, ballot counting and publication of official results of the recent elections, those aspects will be permanently rescinded
- Shots were fired in the vicinity of thousands of Belgrade protestors by Serbian police and tear gas was also used
- Two girls killed and more than ten people injured in Belgrade conflicts between protestors and police – BETA
- Opposition leaders claim some policemen join protestors
- After several attempts, opposition supporters successfully entered Parliament during the afternoon and set fire to part of the building as police withdrew
- Supporters also took over Serbian State TV as well as several local TV stations and transmitters, interrupting regularly scheduled programming to broadcast events in Belgrade throughout Serbia

The HQ for the Protection of Dignity of the Homeland War and Protection of Croat Rights in BiH organized a peaceful protest rally in west Mostar to express dissatisfaction with the current status of the Croat people in BiH. The organization's president Nino Vidovic stated he undoubtedly shares the opinion of those in attendance that every attack against Croats in BiH must encourage unity. Rally speakers, including HVIDR-a President Miro Grabovac Titan, condemned IC bias and demanded that the IC and BiH Federation officials stop criminalizing the Homeland War and stop the illegal use 'black-masked units.'
