In addition, he is on the U.S. list of persons to which all assets have been frozen due to suspicion of supporting the war crime suspects. As bad sides of the Statute, Kukic cited the six electoral units, which match the former municipalities. In that context, Kukic said it gave hope to some people that everything would return to the way it was, once the IC has left. Kukic also noted that the religious communities should play a larger part in connecting severed ties among the citizens. All participants agreed that divisions in cities in BiH were untenable, which cannot represent the future for BiH.

To put it simply, there is a question, whose is the BiH PBS. Does it only belong to citizens of the FBiH or citizens of the whole of BiH. The consequence will be a radical weakening of the position of the RTV FBiH, with the simultaneous strengthening of the other two broadcasters. The ultimate consequence could be, concretely, a definitive shutting down of the FBiH RTV and going back to two broadcasters –one in Sarajevo, the other in Banja Luka. The message of going back to the logic is more than clear – two state, two RTVs", says Kukic.
