

OHR RTRS News Summary, 1 October 2000

News Headlines:

- SIK rejects complaint of DOS on election ballot fraud, assesses it to be unfounded
- DOS makes dress rehearsal of civil disobedience by blocking Belgrade streets for 30 minutes at a time
- Other Serbian towns make dress rehearsals of disobedience by blocking roads, no incidents reported
- DOS calls Yugoslav citizens to general strike on 2 October, blockade of state institutions and civil disobedience
- Milosevic congratulates Yugoslav Volleyball Team on winning gold medal in Sydney Games, and decorates them with Nemanja Medal of First Degree
- Serbian Demo-Christian party calls on Yugoslav National Volleyball Team not to allow themselves to be used for political propaganda
- Kolubara miners say they are under extreme pressure because of their work stoppage protesting non-recognition of presidential election results
- Dienstbier supports resolution of political crisis in Yugoslavia through dialogue
- Milosevic refuses Ivanov initiative on ballot re-count – G-17 PLUS
- G-17 PLUS starts initiative to compare its vote count with results of Yugoslav Statistics Institute
- Clinton asks Putin to send Ivanov on mediation mission in Yugoslavia – Washington
- Milosevic refuses Russian mediation because he is afraid of truth – Djindjic
- Milosevic refusal of Russian mediation might bring about deterioration of overall situation – SPO official
