RS Interior Ministry has not received any announcements on Bosniak tent-settlement preparations in Banja Luka – Novic (00:20)

RS Interior Minister Sredoje Novic stated that the ministry has received no announcement from Bosniaks concerning the erection of tent settlements in Banja Luka. He added the assessment that this was not only a political but also an economic problem. In his opinion, such settlements could also be erected in other BiH towns, like in Tuzla, Sarajevo, Zenica and other places in BiH Federation as well (he implies: why aren't they).
