Croat Demo-Christians issue press release

The Croat Demo-Christians issued a press release on Croatian President Franjo Tudjman's demand for a third, Croat entity in BiH. The Croat Demo-Christians said that they regard Tudjman's statement as support to their struggle for a Croatian republic in the reconstruction of national communities in BiH. The Dayton Agreement is a total defeat of civilization, freedom, peace and justice and it has become a new prison for the Croat people in BiH, according to the release.
