Dodik meets with representatives of Mostar Serb Returnees Association

00:40 RS Prime Minister Milorad Dodik visited representatives of the Mostar Serb Returnees Association. This is the first time that any RS official has ever visited the Association. As Association President Vujadin Berberovic told RTRS, 465 Serb houses in Mostar have been reconstructed so far, 2,950 Serb returnee families are still waiting for reconstruction of their houses, and 2,400 families have applied to return of their apartments in Mostar. Berberovic said he expects greater cooperation with the RS Government in future.

BiH House of Representatives delegate Nikola Spiric says that BiH Federation politicians have lately become louder in their requests to delete entity names from public documents.
