- Derventa Citizens Prevented Holding of Mass – Memories of Croatian Massacres Still Fresh

Citizens of Drventa blocked the roads leading to this town yesterday morning, in order to prevent the arrival of SFOR buses with Cardinal Vinko Pulji}, 40 priests and a Croat congregation, who were supposed to hold a mass there. An SFOR vehicle hit and heavily injured a Serb citizen. The RS Minister of Internal Affairs, Milovan Stankovi}, stated that this incident could be directly linked to the murder of two Serbs in Drvar, in order to distract public attention. He said that Derventa was chosen because a number of its current citizens originally come from Drvar and Petrovac.

The referendum on foreign mediation in solving the Kosovo crisis started this morning in Serbia. According to worldwide media and national politicians' expectations, a huge majority of citizens will respond negatively. Only few hours prior to the opening of the polling stations, about 200 armed terrorists from Albania tried to break into Yugoslavia, at the village of Košare, and the fighting lasted the whole night.
