## Headlines

- "We are determined to do two main things: continue the political process employing all efforts, because I think truth and justice are on our side, but also defend the country with all means, proportionate to the attacks.", said the Yugoslav President, Slobodan Milosevic, in his address today to the nation.
- Boris Yeltsin calls upon the international community to stop Clinton taking the dramatic step of attacking Yugoslavia.
- NATO operation in Yugoslavia named "Resolute Force" in the first phase: strikes against Yugoslav anti-aircraft defence.
- In their declaration RS NA condemn NATO threats to bomb Yugoslavia.
- Carlos Westendorp sent letters to Mirko Sarovic and Petar Djokic.
- Romano Prodi the new chairman of the European Commission.

The Yugoslav President, Slobodan Milosevic addressed the nation today saying that "the only right thing to do was reject the deployment of foreign troops on the territory of the FRY". He stressed that the issue was not just Kosovo and Metohija but the freedom of entire Yugoslavia.

"The support of the Russian leadership and Russian people in this crucial moment is very important to the people of Yugoslavia", said Milosevic in a telephone conversation with the Russian PM Yevgeni Primakov.

Russian President, Boris Yeltsin addressed the nation today,

urging that military action against Yugoslavia not be taken.

China demands **NATO** reverses its decision on air strikes.

Austria will not take part in the <u>NATO</u> action.

81% of Britons oppose <u>NATO</u> air strikes, claims the BBC survey.

USA, Germany, UK, Russia, France and Canada evacuate personnel from their Belgrade embassies.
