The foreign currency payment of teachers' salaries was completed today. Do teachers have a reason to be dissatisfied? They again announced a strike warning for who knows when.

"The payment of salaries is complete, but the exchange rate, the so-called "street" exchange, was 4.5, which caused revolt and bitterness, given the fact that the special Collective contract had not been respected. Thus, salaries have been reduced, without a credit for previous work and all other things which make a complete salary," according to Ranka Misic, president of the Branch Trade Union of Education, Culture and Science.
