Deputy Head of the Public Security Centre in S. Sarajevo, Srdjan Knezevic, was buried today. Knezevic was killed by masked attackers firing from an automatic weapon in Pale two days ago.

Serb Patriarch Pavle visited the Liplje monastery, near Teslic, for the first time, where he served holy liturgy on the holy feast day of this monastery.

The RS PM, Milorad Dodik, political leadership, family and a few thousand citizens of Srpsko Sarajevo solemnly escorted the last remains of the Deputy Head of the Srpsko Sarajevo PSC and legendary commander of the White Wolf brigade, Srdjan Knezevic. "It's as if these times take the best of men, and you seem to be one of them"- Minister of Interior, Milovan Stankovic, said at the funeral. "You died confronting cowards, thieves and criminals, and I promise you, as the Minister of Interior, that the executors and those who gave the orders will taste justice"- the Minister also said. The RS President paid her last respects to Srdjan Knezevic at the commemorative session held in Pale this morning.

The B&H Presidency member, Momcilo Krajisnik, condemned the killing of Srdjan Knezevic. Expressing his condolences, Krajisnik called upon the RS authorities to find the murders as soon as possible and punish them.
